In proposing the toast to the Society James thanked Richard for helping to circulate 220 OFs but was sad responses numbered only 46.

Andrew proposed the toast to the College by giving an eloquent report of the recent unveiling by Richard of the new Sixth Form Centre, Cafe and four classrooms to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the College which was partly funded by generous donations from many OFs and the Society.

Richard introduced Neil who spoke in graphic detail on the researches he had made on Gordon's life from leaving Fram to go to Canada and enlisting in Lord Strathcona's Horse as a key member under Major Seely in the Canadian Cavalry Brigade to leading his last 'It's a charge Boys' at Moreuil Wood in the last year of that ghastly war. Of particular interest to the "Suffolk Boys" is that thousands of tons of feed were shipped from the county to France to feed the million army horses there. Although heard before by six of the party who were on the Three Heroes Tour in April, the telling of the material amassed by Neil was not lost for one moment.

Neil then proposed the Toast to "Those Who Gave Their Lives" and the President presented him with his OF tie upon recent election to membership of the Society.
