## JEAN CHARLES MONTREUIL CROIX DE GUERRE (1908-09)

He was born on 26 February 1891 at Hornfleur in Calvados (14), France. Despite his French background he appears to have won the Gooch Medal for Elocution in 1909, at the College! It remains a mystery why he was educated at the College.

He was recruited at Lisieux and during WW1 served in the French Heavy Artillery and was awarded the Croix de Guerre with Palm. Shown is his war record.

He was killed in action at Nieuport in Belgium on 17th April 1915, aged 24. His rank was 2nd class. We think his regiment was either 192nd or 152nd Artillery Regiment, 10th corps. We believe RAP is 'regiment d'artillerie a pied'?

We don't know where he is buried but his name is apparently on the 'Monument aux Morts' in Hornfleur (Place Albert Sorel) – see below.
