James Sydney Hodges was serving as 2nd Mate on the SS Orontes in 1918 and fell ill. He was transferred to the Marine Hospital in Boston, Massachusetts where he died from pneumonia and influenza on 25th September 1918. The Orontes had been used as a troopship bringing troops from Australia but as it was refrigerated, it was returned to freight use. As the ship was no longer being used by the military, I suspect that's why he doesn't appear in the CWGC records as a war death.
