born in London on the 3rd October, 1875, was the fourth son of James Bird Garnham, of 59, Amhurst Park, London, N.

He was educated at Framlingham College, Suffolk, and afterwards went into business in London.

On the outbreak of war in August, 1914, he volunteered for active



service, and in the following October obtained a temporary commission as Sub-Lieutenant in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, being attached to the London Division. Mr. Garnham was subsequently appointed to the "Nelson" Battalion of the Royal Naval Division, being promoted to temporary Lieutenant in December, 1914, and proceeded with his Battalion to the Dardanelles early in 1915. He was killed instantaneously by machine-gun fire, on the 3rd May, 1915, and was buried in Gallipoli Peninsula. Lieutenant-Colonel E. G. Eveleigh, R.M., commanding the "Nelson" Battalion, who was himself afterwards killed in action, wrote of Lieutenant Garnham: "He was an excellent officer, full of zeal, and only too anxious to learn and make himself efficient."

Two men wrote of Lieutenant Garnham: "He was a fine man; every inch of him was good. We would follow him anywhere—and we did, too! He was our favourite officer. A better fellow than Garnham never breathed. He was thought the world of by B Coy."

Lieutenant Garnham married Edith, daughter of John Masham, and left three children, Percy Cyril Claude, born in January, 1901; Hilda Mary, born in August, 1902; and Eileen, born in March, 1907.
