

## PROFESSOR ROBERT "BOB" MICHAEL KER FOX (R66-71)

He was born on 18 September 1952 and on leaving the College has had a distinguished academic career around the world.

He was Associate Director of the Centre for the Advancement of Education at Curtin University, Australia for 13 years; a senior lecturer in Hong Kong's Vocational Training Council for four years; a TEFL teacher for five years in Hong Kong and Spain and a further education lecturer for two years in England.



Then between 2000-2013 he was Associate Professor and Deputy Director, Centre for Information Technology in Education at the University of Hong Kong (HKU) with one year at the Chinese University of Hong Kong as Professor and Associate Director, Centre for Learning Enhancement and Research before returning to HKU in 2009. He was also A/Dean (Learning Environments), Faculty of Education at HKU. He was awarded HKU's University Teaching Fellowship for excellence in teaching.

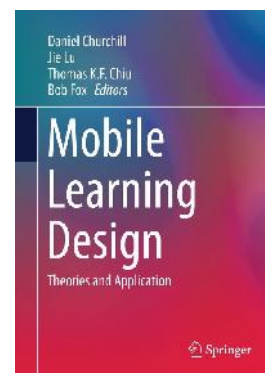
In 2013 was appointed Professor and Deputy Director of Learning and Teaching Unit at The University of New South Wales (UNSW), Sydney, Australia. He also holds concurrent appointments as Honorary Professor, Faculty of Education, HKU and Adjunct Professor of Innovation in Higher Education, School of Education, UNSW.

His research interests focus on technological practice and change; teacher professional development; innovative use of new technology; blended learning and MOOCs; and the impact of technology on physical learning environments.

He has extensive involvement in international academic and professional communities. This includes publishing more than 180 academic papers and sitting on major international editorial boards. He has been a keynote and invited speaker in numerous international conferences and has been on the program and organizing committees of over forty international and local conferences. He has supervised bachelors, masters and doctoral students.
